Multilingual Approaches in Illinois Adult Education

What are multilingual approaches?

Multilingual approaches are programmatic and instructional strategies to **supplement**—not **replace**—English instruction. These approaches...

- Recognize and use adults' varied linguistic backgrounds to support English language acquisition
- Help adults use prior knowledge and experience to accelerate language learning
- Can be used in ELA, IELCE, Bridge, and ICAPS classes to enhance English acquisition and prepare for bilingual career pathways



A Program Serving Students Who Share One Language Background

Pui Tak Center



Offers an ICAPS in Foodservice Management for Chinese-speaking students already working in food service.

- Collaborative Teaching: 75% of class time with an English instructor and 25% with Cantonese and Mandarin-speaking vocational instructors
- Translation: Pui Tak staff translated study materials and credential exam with permission from the certification company
- Credential Exam: offered in Chinese
- Outcome: 70% of enrolled students have received the industry-recognized Master Certified Foodservice Professional credential, allowing them to advance their careers or start their own business



Programs Serving Students with Multiple Language Backgrounds

Trellus



Uses AI translation and audio to develop **multilingual videos** to support students from 30+ language backgrounds along their educational journey.

- Completed: Instructors developed video scripts for topics such as orientation and classroom etiquette
- In Progress: Multilingual videos to introduce Bridge and ICAPS classes, as well as other continuing education options
- Goal: Students will be informed and empowered to ask questions about opportunities beyond English classes

World Relief



Believes that a student's language level should never be a barrier to accessing education.

- Identify Shared Core Languages: Gather data on students' first, second, and third languages (of over 50 languages) and use this information to identify commonly shared languages for interpretation
- Interpretation and Translation: Focus on shared core languages for recruitment, registration, and enrollment, as well as support for digital literacy, success coach mentoring, and targeted industry-specific content
- Outcome: Significant increases in MSGs for English learners completing World Relief's bridge programming
